SELECTION CRITERIA FOR FALL TERM

Youngstown State University is test optional for Fall 2021. The Admissions Office will perform a holistic review based on high school coursework, academic rigor and grades received in "core curriculum" for those students who do not submit ACT or SAT scores. If a student submits ACT or SAT scores, applicants must have a minimum 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale, and a 17 ACT composite (920 SAT combined

Evidence-based Writing and Reading test score and Math score) for unconditional admission. Applicants not meeting these requirements may be considered on a conditional basis. Entering students may be required to take a reading, writing, and math placement test.
